PRESENTATION

In 2013, the Encyclopédie de la parole initiated a cycle of four "Choral Suites" all based on the same principle: the live reproduction of documents taken from the Encyclopédie de la parole's audio collection.

After Suite N°2 which orchestrated action-words (spoken words that prompted or meant actions), Suite N° 3 'Europe' is about the effects that spoken words have on us, and in particular their undesirable effects. In our daily lives, we are overwhelmed by utterances that we would prefer not to hear, that disgust us, bother us, repulse us, make us angry, depress us, shock us, embarrass us, annoy us, or make us feel sorry for their issuers. What do we do with them? What strategies do we adopt to keep them at a distance? Can theatre and music allow us to neutralise them, to momentarily ward off their violence, to change and deepen the way we consider them?

With the help of a group of correspondents across all of Europe, Encyclopédie de la parole has endeavoured to search for recent recordings of spoken words that, for various reasons and to varying degrees, we are reluctant to listen to: condescending sermons, safety instructions, hate speech, embarrassing claims, verbal abuse, monologues of solitude, police brutality, nationalistic poems, standardised job interviews, counselling, public humiliation, adolescent moaning ... We have selected 26 of them in the 24 languages of the European Union.

As with Suite $N^{\circ}1$ and Suite $N^{\circ}2$, these utterances are faithfully re-enacted by two performers in order to render their oral dimension and all their melodic, rhythmic, intensive and timbral nuances. Re-enacting them is a way to make their reality audible whilst transposing them into the fictional setting of a theatre.

However, this time we have decided to add an explicitly musical dimension to them: for each of these 'unlistenable' words we have added a piano accompaniment which makes them sound like folk songs, opera recitatives, French melodies, German lieds, Portuguese fados, pop hits or contemporary pieces. At times, the piano implicitly reveals an unexpected chorus; at times it highlights the melody or the rhythmic cadence of the words. Sometimes it imposes a disconcerting tone or even cuts loose from its accompanying function to become a competing voice. In all cases, it shifts the act of listening to an unexpected and paradoxical place.

For make no mistake, by staging and putting problematic words to music, we are engaging in a joyous exorcism, an attempt to free ourselves from the influence and the venom of *forked tongues*.

ENCYCLOPÉDIE DE LA PAROLE

L'Encyclopédie de la parole is an artistic project exploring the spoken word in all its forms. Since 2007, this group of musicians, poets, directors, visual artists, actors, sociolinguists, and curators have been collecting all sorts of recordings of words and then indexing them on its website according to their particular properties or phenomena such as cadence, chorality, emphasis, saturation or melody.

What do the following have in common: the poetry of Marinetti or Allen Ginsberg, a sport commentary, a lecture by Jacques Lacan, an excerpt from South Park, the flow of Eminem and Lil Wayne, a message left on an answering machine, a TV game show, an Adventist sermon, an excerpt from The Young and the Restless, a speech by Léon Blum or Bill Clinton, an auctioneer selling horses, a shamanic incantation, a lawyer's closing arguments, a commercial for shampoo and casual conversations recorded in the local café?

From this collection, which now includes about 800 sound documents, L'Encyclopédie de la parole produces sound pieces, performance and shows, lectures, games and exhibitions.

Currently in 2017, the Encyclopédie de la parole has brought together Frédéric Danos, Emmanuelle Lafon, Nicolas Rollet, Joris Lacoste, David Christoffel, Valérie Louys et Elise Simonet.

JORIS LACOSTE

Joris Lacoste has been writing for theater and radio since 1996 and has been producing his own shows since 2003.

He created *9 lyriques pour actrice et caisse claire* in 2005 with Stéphanie Béghain and *Purgatoire* at the Théâtre National de la Colline in 2007. From 2007 to 2009, he was co-director of Les Laboratoires d'Aubervilliers. Taking his inspiration from literature, theater, dance, visual arts, music, sound poetry, his work is always deeply researched.

In 2009 he launched the project "Hypnographie" to explore artistic uses of hypnosis: he produced the radio play *Au Musée du sommeil* (2009), the exhibition-performance *Le Cabinet d'hypnose* (2010), the exhibition *12 prepared dreams* (GB Agency Paris 2012), the play *Le vrai spectacle* (2011) and the performance art pieces *Restitution* (2010), *La maison vide* (2012), and *4 prepared dreams* (for April March, Jonathan Caouette, Tony Conrad and Annie Dorsen) in New York in October 2012.

He started two collective projects, le projet W in 2004, and L'Encyclopédie de la Parole in 2007 with which he has created the shows Parlement (2009), $Suite\ N^{o}1$ (2013), $Suite\ N^{o}2$ (2015) and $Suite\ n^{o}3$ 'Europe' (2017).

PIERRE-YVES MACÉ

Pierre-Yves Macé's music stands at the nexus of contemporary classical, electroacoustic composition and sound art. Born in 1980, France, Pierre-Yves Macé studies music (piano, classical percussion) eventually turning to self-taught composition.

His first recording, *Faux-Jumeaux*, was released on Tzadik, John Zorn's label, in 2002. It was followed by several records on Sub Rosa, Orkhêstra and Brocoli. His music has been performed by ensemble l'Instant Donné, pianist Denis Chouillet, British soprano singer Natalie Raybould, reed player Sylvain Kassap, and Amôn string quartet. Macé has been invited and/or commissioned new pieces by the Festival d'Automne à Paris (monographic concert in 2012, at the Théâtre des Bouffes du Nord in Paris), Villette Sonique (Paris), Ars Musica (Bruxelles), Les Musiques, MIMI (Marseille), AngelicA (Bologna), Santarcangelo (Rimini), Akousma (Montreal)... As a performer, he opened for Matmos, Richard Chartier, Andrew Bird, among others.

He has collaborated with writers/directors Christophe Fiat, Joris Lacoste, dancers Anne Collod, Fabrice Ramalingom. He has won the 2014 « hors les murs » grant (French Institute) for the Contreflux project, which involved a one-month residency in the US. As an accomplished scholar of musicology (University of Paris VIII), he is the author of the book Musique et document sonore ("Music and Sonic Documents").

PRODUCTIONS 2007-2017

SUITE N°3 'Europe' (creation, 2017)



Suite N°3 seeks to go further into music, this time staging an actual recital: a collection of 24 spoken documents to be performed like so many songs, melodies, arias, lieder. Interpreted by two singers – one man and one woman – and accompanied by a pianist, they will be spoken in the 24 official languages of the European Union. Taking the form of a recital, this typically European context of high culture, the music produces a paradoxical effect, like the overlapping of two separate planes: that of beauty, of culture, of distinction, of complicity... and that, blocking all possibility of identification, of ordinary verbal violence.

SUITE N°2 (show, 2015)



The second Suite of Encyclopédie de la parole orchestrates speeches that all do something, speeches that are actions. All of these words are real. Each and every one of them has been pronounced some day, somewhere in the world, then collected by the Encyclopédie de la parole. They meet for the first time in this piece, carried by a quintet of outstanding performers, composed by Joris Lacoste and harmonized by Pierre-Yves Macé.

SUITE Nº1 (show, 2013)



Conceived and directed by Joris Lacoste, the first of the Suites chorales presents a selection of extracts from the Encyclopédie de la parole's collection of sound documents, performed by a chorus in unison. How we learn to speak, how we take the floor, the abc's, the babbling, the blabla, the hubbub, the basic vocabulary, the joy of talking for talking's sake, the game of translation and the pleasure of languages that we don't understand. An ABC of ordinary speech in 45 scenes, nine languages, with twenty-two actors (including 11 volunteers/guests) and a conductor.

CHORALE (performance, 2009)



Chorale is a twenty-minute performance made up of 7 or 8 documents from Encyclopédie de la parole's collection performed in a chorus by a group of actors or performing artists. Chorale is played in different languages in different countries; its repertory and interpreters change according to latitude, custom and season. Chorale is directed by Nicolas Rollet and staged by Joris Lacoste.

LA CONFÉRENCE-MARABOUT (performance, 2011)



Part lecture-performance part conference, Marabout enables visitors to discover the collection of L'Encyclopédie de la parole. Indexed to the map that presents the Encyclopédie's website, Marabout functions as a series of displacements from one document to the other.

PIÈCES SONORES (concerts, 2007)



L'Encyclopédie de la parole has been commissioning pieces from composers, sound artists or radio writers on a regular basis since 2007. Each time, the latter are to create a piece from the archive of recordings included in one entry of the encyclopédie, i.e., a specific speech phenomenon.

COLLECTION (exhibition, 2011)



The art center of La Villa Arson in Nice offered L'Encyclopédie de la parole the opportunity to exhibit its sound collection as a whole. The installation designed to this end took the form of a 300 square-meter floor-map, on which the approximately 500 documents making up the collection at the time were outlined. Each visitor was able to listen to each document with a specific device, as he/she walked from one entry to another.
